



General Operation

Charging the Battery

When you use this unit for the first time, or after being unused for a long period of time, recharge the battery fully.

- Risk of product damage! Ensure that the power supply voltage corresponds to the voltage printed on the back or the underside of the unit.
- When low power occurs, you can see the
 icon on the unit's display panel flashing. It is time to charge the battery.
- Connect the DC power adapter to the wall socket for charging.

Note

The battery mark is NOT an indicator of battery power, it is just an icon to "charging battery". Battery performance varies with the content played and loudness at which it is played. In typical usage, the speaker battery lasts up to seven hours.

Powering ON/OFF

- Press the \bigcirc/\bigcirc button to switch the unit on.
- Press and hold the ७/፲ button to switch the unit off.

Selecting Modes

Press the $0/\square$ button repeatedly to select **USB**, **AUX**, **BT** (Bluetooth®) or **FM** mode.

The selected mode will show on the display.



 If there is no signal under the USB, AUX and BT mode, the unit will automatically switch off after 15 minutes.

Setting the Clock

- Press the M button, then press the ◄/➤I
 buttons repeatedly to select CL K.... and press
 the ➤□ button to confirm. The hour indicator
 will flash.
- Press the ◄
 buttons to adjust the hour, then press the ►II to confirm. The minute indicator will flash.
- Press the ◄
 buttons to adjust the minutes, then press the ►■ button to confirm, then the unit will enter the CLOCK SYNC mode.
 - RBDS Only synchronize with the RBDS radio station.
 - OFF Turns off the clock synchronization function and only adjusts the clock manually.
- Press the ⋈/⋈ buttons to select RBDS or OFF, then press the ►□ button to confirm. The time setting is completed.
- Press the M button to exit the menu or the unit will exit the menu automatically after 20 seconds.

Setting the Sleep Timer

Use the sleep timer to turn the system off after a set number of minutes in play mode.

- Press the M button, then press the IM/INI
 buttons repeatedly to select SLEEP and press
 the INI
 button to confirm.
- Press the I◄/► buttons to adjust the number of minutes shown on the display in this sequence.

- Press the ►" button to confirm when your desired number of minutes is displayed. The SLEEP timer is now set.
- Press the M button to exit the menu or the unit will exit the menu automatically after 20 seconds.

Adjusting the Brightness of the Display Panel

 Press the M button, then press the H4/→H buttons repeatedly to select DIMMER and press the →III button to confirm.

- Press the ⋈/> buttons repeatedly to select different levels of brightness and press the button to confirm.
- Press the M button to exit the menu or the unit will exit the menu automatically after 20 seconds.

Adjusting the Volume

 Press the VOL+/- buttons to increase/decrease the volume level.

Selecting a Preset Sound Effect


- Press the M button, then press the M/N
 buttons repeatedly to select EQ and press the
 button to confirm.
- Press the ⋈/⋈ buttons repeatedly to select: [FLAT], [POP], [JAZZ], [ROCK], [CLASSIC], and press the ⋈ button to confirm.
- Press the M button to exit the menu or the unit will exit the menu automatically after 20 seconds.

Turning the Bass ON/OFF

- Press the M button, then press the M/N
 buttons repeatedly to select BASS and press
 the N button to confirm.
- Press the IM/IM buttons repeatedly to turn the bass on or off, and press the IM button to confirm.
- 3. Press the **M** button to exit the menu or the unit will exit the menu automatically after 20 seconds.


Play from AUX

Connect the audio player.
 Connect the 3.5mm to 3.5mm audio cable to the AUX socket on the rear of unit and to the headphone socket on the audio player.



- Press the button repeatedly to select the AUX source.

Play from USB



- 1. Lift up the cover on the top panel.
- 2. Insert the USB device.
- 3. Press the 🗗 button repeatedly to select the USB source.
- 4. During playback:
- To pause or resume play, press the ► ubutton.

- To search during play: press and hold the ◄/>>I buttons, then release to resume normal play.

Play With Bluetooth® Device

Play With Bluetooth® Device

- Keep this player away from any other electronic devices that may cause interference.
- Press the button repeatedly to select BT (Bluetooth®) mode. "No BT" will show on the display if the unit is not paired to any Bluetooth® device, the system has entered pairing mode.
- Activate your Bluetooth® device and select the search mode. "HeadRush 8016806" will appear on your Bluetooth® device.
- 3. Select "HeadRush 8016806" in the pairing list. Display panel shows "BLU ET" when the pairing process is successful.

Tips:

- Enter "0000" for the password if necessary.
- If a connection exists, press and hold the
 ▶II button on the top of the unit to re-activate
 the pairing mode. The existing connection
 will be interrupted.
- If no other Bluetooth® device pairs with this player within two minutes, the player will recover its previous connection.
- The player will also be disconnected when your device is moved beyond the operational range.
- If you want to reconnect your device to this player, place it within the operational range.
- If the device was moved beyond the operational range, then brought back in range, check if the device is still connected to the player.
- If the connection was lost, follow the instructions above to pair again your device to the player.

Listen to Music from Bluetooth® Device

- If the connected Bluetooth® device supports
 Advanced Audio Distribution Profile (A2DP),
 you can listen to the music stored on the
 device through the player.
- If the device also supports Audio Video Remote Control Profile (AVRCP), you can use the player's buttons to play music stored on the device.

Auto Scan and Save Preset Station

 activate automatic programming.
- The display will read "AUTO" before scanning.
- All stations found will be automatically stored.
- The first programmed radio station is played automatically.
- Tune to a Preset Radio Station
- Press the ⋈/▶ buttons repeatedly to select the preset number that you want.

Tuning in a Station

- Tune in to radio stations automatically
- Press and hold the ►
 frequency changes down or up automatically until a station is found.



The search may not stop at a station with a very weak signal.

Presetting Stations Manually

You can preset up to 20 FM stations.

- Tune in the desired station, then press the M button, then press the M/>> buttons repeatedly to select MEMORY.
- 2. Press the ►II button to confirm, then press the IM()►II buttons to select the preset number.
- 3. Press the ▶ u button to store the station.
- 4. Repeat the above steps 1 to 3 for each station you want to store into the memory with a preset number.
- Press the M button to exit the menu or the unit will exit the menu automatically after 20 seconds.

Showing Information

- Press the M button, then press the M/→
 buttons repeatedly to select INFO and press
 the → button to confirm.
- Press the IM/IM buttons repeatedly to scroll through the following information:
 Station Text/Station Name/ Program Type/RBDS Clock.
- Press the ►II button to confirm.
- Press the M button to exit the menu or the unit will exit the menu automatically after 20 seconds.

- Ensure that the unit is switched on.

- Ensure that the unit is switched on.
- Ensure that the Bluetooth® function is activated on your Bluetooth® device.
- The unit has a Bluetooth® function that can receive a signal within 8 metres. Keep a distance within 8 metres between the unit and your Bluetooth® device.

Poor radio reception

- Increase the distance between the unit and your TV or VCR.
- Fully extend the FM antenna.

No response of button or function error

- Restart again.
