# **Instruction Manual**

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# **Important Safety Instructions**

# **Safety Information**

To ensure reliable and safe operation of this equipment, please read all the instructions in this user guide carefully, especially the safety information below.

### Electrical safety

- The TV set should only be connected to a main power supply with voltage that matches the label at the rear of the product
- To prevent overload, do not share the same power supply socket with too many other electronic components
- Do not place any connecting wires where they may be stepped on or tripped over
- Do not place heavy items on them, which may damage the leads
- Hold the main plug, not the wires, when removing from a socket
- During a thunderstorm or when not using the television for long periods, turn off the power switch on the back of the television
- Do not allow water or moisture to enter the TV or power adapter. Do NOT use in wet, moist areas, such as bathrooms, steamy kitchens or near swimming pools
- Pull the plug out immediately and seek professional help if the main plug or cable is damaged, liquid has spilt onto the set, if accidentally exposed to water or moisture, if anything accidentally penetrates the ventilation slots or if the set does not work normally





### Front View




### **Button Functions**

- 1. (I) POWER: Turns on/standby the TV set
- 2. **SOURCE**: Displays the input source menu
- 3. MENU: Displays the OSD menu. Press again to exit the menu
- 4. CH V/∧: Scans through channels
- 5. **VOL +/-:** Adjusts the volume
- 6. IR: Infared Receiver
- 7. LED: The LED light indicates when the TV is activated


# **Wall Mounting**

The TV is provided with mounting holes for a VESA-approved wall mounting bracket (not supplied). The VESA mounting pattern is 400 x 400. Remove the screws holding the base to the base bracket and lift the base away (do not remove the base mounting brackets). Mount the VESA bracket using  $4 \times M6 \times 12$ mm isometric threaded screws (not supplied).


Warning: To prevent injury, this apparatus must be securely attached to the floor/wall in accordance with the installation instructions.

# **Remote Control Button Functions**



- 1. 0: Switch the TV between on and standby mode.
- 2. Mute and restore your TV sound.
- 3. 0-9: Select a program. (ATV/DTV mode)
- 4. —: Use to enter a digital subchannel such as 2-1.
- 5.  $\diamondsuit$ : Return to previous viewing channel.
- 6. MENU: Display the OSD "on screen display" menu.
- 7. **SOURCE:** Select among the different input signal sources: TV/Component/AV/HDMI1/HDMI2/HDMI3/VGA/USB.
- 8. OK: Confirm the selection in the OSD "on screen display" menus.
- 9. ◀ ▲ ▼ ▶: Allows you to navigate the OSD menus and adjust the system settings to your preference.
- 10. RETURN: Return to previous menu.
- 11. EXIT: Exit the OSD menu.
- 12. VOL +/-: Adjust the volume.
- 13. TV: Press this button to turn to TV source.
- 14. REPEAT: Select between different repeat modes (USB mode).
- 15. CH: Select a channel.
- **16. ◀:** Reverse playback rapidly. (USB mode)
- 17. Advance playback rapidly. (USB mode)
- 18. I◀: Skip to the beginning of the previous chapter/track/photo. (USB mode)
- 19. II: Start playback or pause. (USB mode)
- 20. Stop the playback. (USB mode)
- 22. A/B/C/D: Push once to select a favourite channel; push and hold to save current channel as favourite.
- **23.** MTS: Switch among different audio channels STEREO/MONO/SAP.
- 24. V-CHIP: Set up parental control.
- **25. CC:** Closed Caption selection: ON/OFF/CC on Mute.
- **26. P.MODE:** Select picture mode: Dynamic/Movie/PC Mode (HDMI/VGA Mode)/User/Standard.
- 27. S.MODE: Select sound mode: standard/music/movie/user.
- **28. SLEEP:** Set the TV sleep timer: OFF/5/10.../180/240 min.
- 29. ASPECT: Select the aspect ratio settings: standard/wide/wide zoom/zoom/JUST SCAN (HDMI only)/Auto/Dot by Dot (VGA).
- **30. DISPLAY:** Display the present screen information such as the current channel and input source.
- 31. AUTO: Press to adjust the picture automatically in VGA source.
- **32. HDMI/VGA/USB:** Press the appropriate button to change inputs: HDMI, VGA or USB.

If there is light around the TV, the remote control may fail or work abnormally. If not using the remote for a long period of time, please remove the batteries.

# **Remote Control Button Functions**

### **Button Position(ARC CEC Functions)**

- **16. ◀:** Press **◄** for a quick rewind search.
- 17. Press button for quick forward search.
- 19. II: When playing the disc, press PLAY/PAUSE to normal play.
- 20. : When playing DVD, SVCD, VCD, CD, press STOP to stop the play.
- 21. When playing a DVD disc, press **NEXT** to go to the next chapter. When playing SVCD, VCD disc, press **NEXT** to go to the next track.

# Basic Operations Turning Your TV On and Off

### TURN ON TV


- 1. Connect to power with the main power cable. The TV will enter STANDBY mode and the LED indicator light will be red.
- 2. From the STANDBY mode, use the POWER button either on the main unit or on the remote, to turn the television on.

### TURN OFF TV

From ON mode, use the POWER button either on the main unit or on the remote control to turn the television to STANDBY mode.

### Select Your Onscreen Language Preference

**Note:** If using your TV for the first time, select the onscreen language which will be used to display menus and information boxes.




The first time you turn the TV on it will go into the Setup Wizard. Press the ◀ ▲ ▼ ▶ buttons to highlight and select your desired mode. Press OK to confirm

# Volume Adjustment

- 1. Press VOL +/- to adjust the volume.
- 2. To turn the sound off, press MUTE 💢 . Press again to resume sound.

# Navigating the Onscreen Display

- Press the MENU button to display the main menu
- Use the ◀/▶ buttons to navigate and select the available menus



# Choosing a TV Channel

1. Use the CH∧/CH∨ buttons on the main unit or on the remote control.

- Press CH∧ to increase the channel
- Press CHV to decrease the channel


### 2. Using **0-9** remote keys

Enter the channel number with the 0-9 remote keys, then press "**OK**" to select the channel. For example:

- 1. Press 4, then press "OK" to select channel 4
- 2. Press 4, press 5, then press "OK" to select channel 45
- 3. Press 1, then 2, press 1 and then press "OK" to select channel 121

### Selecting Input Source

Display the input screen menu by pressing **SOURCE** on the remote control or **SOURCE** on the side of the TV. Press the  $\sqrt{}$  button to select your choice, then press "**OK**" to enter using the remote or press SOURCE+ directly on the side of the TV.



### General Menu Options

Press **MENU** on the side of the TV or on the remote control then use **◄/▶** to select the **General** menu. Press **▼** to enter (see picture).

### Menu Language

Press  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$  to select menu language from English, Français or Español.

### Transparency

Press ▲/▼ then use ◀/▶ to turn the transparency function ON or OFF.

### Zoom Mode

Press  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$  to switch between zoom modes: Auto/Standard/Wide/Wide Zoom/Zoom/Just Scan (HDMI)/ Dot by Dot (VGA).

### VGA Settings

Press  $\triangle/\nabla$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  to select the advanced options for H-POS, V-POS, Clock, Phase, Auto (only used in VGA mode).

### Horizontal POS

Press  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$  to adjust the H-POS of the picture.

### Vertical POS

Press  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$  to adjust the V-POS of the picture.

#### Clock

Press  $\triangle/\nabla$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  to set the clock.

#### Phase

Press  $\triangle/\nabla$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  to adjust the Phase.

#### Auto

Press ▲/▼ then use ◀/▶ adjust the VGA picture automatically.

### Closed Caption

Press  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$  to navigate the closed caption menu, then press  $\blacktriangleright$  to enter into the following menu:

### CC Mode

Select the Closed Caption Mode options from: ON, OFF or CC on Mute.

#### Basic Selection

Select the basic selection from: CC1, CC2, CC3, CC4, Text1, Text2, Text3, Text4.

### Advanced Selection

Press ▲/▼ then use ◀/▶ to select the advanced selection from: Service1, Service2, Service3, Service4, Service5 or Service6.

### Option

Press ▲/▼ then use ◀/▶ to enter into the Option Menu.

Press  $\triangle/\nabla$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  to select.

### DLC

Press ▲/▼ then use ◀/▶ to turn dynamic luminance control ON or OFF.

#### Other Settings

Press ▲/▼ then use ◀/▶ to navigate through and select: INLINK CONTROL, DEVICE POWER OFF, TV POWER OFF, AUDIO RECEIVER, INLINK DEVICE LIST, ROOT MENU.

### HDMI EDID

Select the HDMI version: Mode 1 (HDMI 1.4)/ Mode 2 (HDMI 2.0)

### Inlink Control

Press ▲/▼ then use ◀/▶ to select ON or OFF.









### Device Power Off

Press ▲ / ▼ then use ◀ / ▶ to select ON or OFF.

### TV Power On

Press ▲ / ▼ then use ◀ / ▶ to select ON or OFF.

### Audio Receiver

Press ▲ / ▼ then use ◀ / ▶ to select ON or OFF.

### Inlink Device List

Press ▲ / ▼ then use ◀ / ▶ to adjust the INLINK DEVICE LIST.

### **ROOT MENU**

Press  $\blacktriangle$  /  $\blacktriangledown$  then use  $\P$  /  $\blacktriangleright$  to adjust the ROOT MENU.

### Restore Default

Select "Restore Default", press OK and it will display "are you sure?" Select "Yes" to select the factory default settings.





### Picture Menu Options

Press **MENU** on the side of the TV or **MENU** on the remote control, then use ▲/▼ move within the "Picture Menu". Press ▶ to enter (see picture).

### Picture Mode

Select the type of picture which best corresponds to your viewing preference by selecting "Picture Mode" in the **PICTURE** menu, or enter the picture mode directly by pressing the **P.MODE** button on the remote control.

### Blue Screen

Press  $\blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown$  then use  $\P / \blacktriangleright$  to select ON or OFF.

### **Brightness**

Press  $\triangle$  /  $\nabla$  then use  $\triangleleft$  /  $\triangleright$  to adjust the brightness of the picture.

#### Contrast

Press  $\triangle/\nabla$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  to adjust the contrast of the picture.

#### Colour

Press  $\triangle/\nabla$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  to adjust the colour of the picture.

#### Sharpness

Press  $\triangle/\nabla$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  to adjust the sharpness of the picture.

#### **Tint**

Press  $\triangle/\nabla$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  to adjust the tint of the picture.

Note: To adjust the tint, the TV must be in Tuner mode and receiving a signal. Press ◀/▶ to adjust the intensity of the colour. An increased value of TINT will provide a more colourful picture, a decreased value will provide a more neutral picture. Adjusting the tint function will not affect any other input.

### Colour Temperature

Press **◄/▶** to select mode: Cool, Normal or Warm.

### Advanced Option

Press  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  to select mode: Noise reduction, White Balance, Colour Management, Backlight, Gamma, Reset.

### **MEMC**

Press ▲/▼ then use ◀/▶ to select Medium, High, Off or Low.



### **Audio Menu Options**

Press **MENU** on the main unit or on the remote control then use  $\P/P$  to select the **AUDIO** menu. Press  $\P$  to enter (see picture).

### Sound mode

Press ▲/▼ then use ◀/▶ to select User, Standard, Music and Movie.

#### Bass

Press  $\triangle/\nabla$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  to increase or decrease the level of the lower-pitched sounds.

#### Treble

Press  $\triangle/\nabla$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  to increase or decrease the level of higher-pitched sounds.

### Balance

Press  $\triangle/\nabla$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\triangleright$  to adjust the audio output between left and right speakers.

### Digital Audio Output

Press ▲/▼ then use ◀/▶ to select PCM/RAW.

### Surround Sound

Press **◄/**▶ to switch Surround ON or OFF.

### **AVC (Auto Volume Control)**

Press **◄/▶** to switch auto volume control ON or OFF. This function allows volume to be controlled automatically.

### Audio Language

Press **√**/▶ to select the audio language from: English, French or Spanish (only shown in DTV mode).




### Lock Menu Options

Press **MENU** on the side of the TV or **MENU** on the remote control, then use **◄/▶** to select the **LOCK** menu. Press **▼** button to enter.

Use the ▼ button to go to the "Enter Password" selection and use the numeric buttons to input a 4-digit password. The screen will display the sub-menu. After setting, press the Menu button to exit.

NOTE: The factory password is 0000.



### Change Password

Press the ▲/▼ button to select "Change Password", then input the old 4-digit password. Input the new 4-digit password once and then again to confirm.

### System Lock

Allows you to turn the system lock ON or OFF. If you turn off the system lock, then the following options (US, Canada, RRT Setting and Reset RRT) are unavailable for use.

### USA

Use the ▼ button to highlight the "USA" selection, then press the ▶ button to enter into the menu.

#### Canada

Use the  $\blacktriangledown$  button to highlight the "Canada" selection, then press the  $\blacktriangleright$  button to enter into the following menu.

### Canada English

Use **4/**▶ buttons to select among: E, C, C8+, G, PG, 14+ and 18+.

### Canada French

Use **4/**▶ buttons to select among: E, G, 8ans+, 13ans+, 16ans+ et 18ans+.

### RRT Setting

Rating Region Table setting. (Note: This option is valid in DTV).

### Reset RRT

Allows you to reset the RRT setting.

### Clear Lock

Clear all lock settings.





### **Channel Menu Options**

Press **MENU** on the side of the TV or remote control, then use  $\P/P$  to select the **CHANNEL** menu. Press  $\P$  to enter.

### Air/Cable

Press ▲/▼ then use ◀/▶ to select Air and Cable.

#### Auto Scan

Use the ▼ button to highlight "Auto Scan" then press the ▶ button to enter into the Scanning Channel menu.

### Favourite

Allows you to add any channels that you flag to your favourite channel list.

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  button to highlight the "Favourite" channel, then press the  $\triangleright$  button to enter the menu.

Use the  $\triangle/\nabla$  button to highlight the desired channel, then press the OK button to add or remove the highlighted channel as a favourite.

### Show/Hide

Allows you to show or hide the channels.
Use the ▲/▼ button to highlight the "Show/Hide" item, then press the ▶ button to enter the menu.

Use the ▲/▼ button to highlight the desired item, then press the OK button to show or hide the highlighted channel.

### Channel Number.

Displays the number of the current channel.

### Channel Label


Displays the label of the current channel.


### Signal Information

Displays the quality of the current DTV signal.









### Time Menu Options

Press **MENU** on the side of the TV or on the remote control then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$  to select the **TIME** menu. Press  $\blacktriangledown$  to enter (see picture).

### Sleep Timer

Press  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$  to set the sleep timer from the following selections:

Off, 5 min, 10 min, 15 min, 30 min, 45 min, 60 min, 90 min, 120 min, 180 min or 240 min.

### **OSD Timer**

Press  $\blacktriangle/\blacktriangledown$  then use  $\blacktriangleleft/\blacktriangleright$  to set the OSD timer from the following selections:

Off, 15s, 30s, 60s, 120s, 240s.

### Time Zone

Press ▲/▼ then use ◀/▶ to set up the time zone: Hawaii/Alaska/Pacific/Mountain/Central/Eastern/Atlantic/Newfoundland.

### Daylight Savings Time

Press ▲/▼ then use ◀/▶ to set up the daylight savings time to ON or OFF.

Note: Can only be selected in TV mode.



# **USB Multimedia**

# Viewing Photos

Press the **SOURCE** button on the main unit or on the remote control, then select USB mode. Press the OK button.

Select PHOTO and then press OK button.

Note: File format supported: JPEG.



## Listening to Music

Press the SOURCE button on the main unit or on the remote control, then select USB mode. Press the OK button.

Press the buttons to select MUSIC and then press OK button.

Note: File format supported: MP3

# **Parental Menu Options**

### Parental Control

Press ENTER to enter the sub-menu and then use the O-9 to enter the correct password: 0000. If used, this feature can "block" undesirable programming from appearing on the TV. Parental Control allows the user the capability of defining which program rating they consider acceptable to the younger, more sensitive viewer. It can be preset and turned either on or off by the user who specifies the secret 4-number code, the password. The number of hours blocked are specified. General audiences and children blocks should be both programmed into the TV's memory. Viewer ratings are specified for both TV and the motion picture industry; both rating systems should be used, for complete coverage. The ratings are based on the age of the children.

### Overview

To ensure complete coverage for all TV programs (movies and regular TV shows), choose a rating for MPAA based on the TV Parental Guidelines Rating Systems below. Use the Age Block option to help determine appropriate content for general audiences and for children. In addition to those, you may wish to add additional restrictions from the content block menu and submenus examples below.

### Things to Consider before Setting up Parental Control

Determine which rating you consider acceptable to the viewer (for example, if you choose TV-PG, more restrictive ratings will be automatically blocked; the viewer will not be able to see: TV-PG, TV-14, or TV-MA rated programming.) Do you want to block the auxiliary video source entirely? (Blocks the signal sent by the equipment, such as VCR, connected to the TV Audio/Video input jacks) Or leave unblocked, then choose allowable ratings. Block program "Content" based on individual parameters such as: Strong Dialog, Bad Language, Sex Scenes, Violence Scenes or Fantasy Violent Scenes; in Content Blk option. Select a secret password, in the Set Password option, using the numbers keys on the remote. Do not forget the password; it is the only way you can access the Parental Control menu and change rating selections, or turn Parental Control off. If you wish to disable Parental Controls, you can turn it on or off with the Lock On/Off option.

- · You can set different Parental Control viewing restrictions for general audiences and for children, both can be active at the same time
- Simply specifying one content block such as Sex Scenes, will not automatically restrict the programming that appears from the video sources
- Even if you choose to leave the AUX inputs unblocked, the ratings you specify will automatically restrict the programming that appears from the video sources
- You cannot disable Parental Control by disconnecting the TV from power. Block hours will be automatically reset to the original block time setting specified if power is disconnected

### Maintenance

Early malfunctions can be prevented. Careful and regular cleaning can extend the amount of time you will have with your new TV. Be sure to turn the power OFF and unplug the power cord before you begin any cleaning.

- Do not use your TV in areas that are too hot or too cold, because the cabinet may warp or the screen may malfunction. Your TV works best in temperatures that are comfortable to you
- Storage temperatures are 0° to 50 °C (32° to 122°F)
- Working temperatures are 0° to 40 °C (32° to 104°F)
- Do not place your TV in direct sunlight or near a heat source

### Cleaning the Screen

- 1. Wet a soft cloth in a mixture of lukewarm water and a little fabric softener or dish washing detergent. Wring the cloth until it's almost dry and then use to wipe the screen.
- 2. Make sure the excess water is off the screen, then let air-dry before you turn on the TV.

### Cleaning the Cabinet

To remove dirt or dust, wipe the cabinet with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth. Please be sure not to use a wet cloth.

### Extended Absence



If you expect to leave your TV dormant for a long time (such as a vacation), it is a good idea to unplug the power cord to protect against possible damages from lightning or power surges.
